NextGen News: Focused on the Future

NextGen Caucus at All Canada Progress Meeting



The sixth annual NextGen Caucus will take place at the 2016 All Canada Progress Meeting. Now a full-day, the NextGen Caucus brings together NextGen delegates sent by their Local Unions from across the country to provide an update on what is happening with their Local NextGen Committee, challenges they face and a group discussion on what their wants and needs are to push the NextGen Initiative forward.

National Day of Mourning

On April 28, the National Day of Mourning is observed across our country commemorating workers who have been injured, killed or suffered illness due to workplace related hazards and incidents. Mourn the dead. Fight for the living.

- Established in 1984 at the urging of the Canadian Labour Congress
- Most recent statistics from the Association of Workers' Compensation Boards of Canada tell us 919 workplace deaths were recorded in 2014, which equates to 2.5 deaths every single day.



- Among the 919 dead were 13 young workers ages 15-19; another 25 workers aged 20-24.
- 239,643 claims were accepted in 2014 for lost time due to work-related injury or disease, including 7,998 from young workers aged fifteen to nineteen.

Reach Out and Engage NextGen Electrical Workers

RENEW, for short, is the name of the NextGen program in the US, with the same goal to inspire the next generation of IBEW workers to become active in their Local Unions by focusing on issues important to young workers, providing education about the IBEW and the labour movement, and fostering relationships with members and local union leadership.



The International RENEW Advisory Committee, a council comprised of young IBEW leaders from each of the 11 districts and the Electrical Workers Minority Caucus, has been created to support the advancement of the activities of emerging RENEW and NextGen committees. The council meets about two times per year to strategize ways to increase union participation and activism among its peers and facilitate communication and cooperation between committees, their Districts and the International Office. In teams, the NextGeners went door to door, knocked in signs, greeted and especially, engaged the surrounding communities supporting political representatives that also upheld our strong union values.

As well as being engaged in our communities, the NextGen Committee has strived to get involved within our Local Union. Educating ourselves on the history of our Local Union and the contribution of the IBEW in the history of the organized labour movement as a whole. Our committee members have been involved with the Retiree Club, Labour Day Committee, Sports Committee, Education Committee, and the Social Committee. Though the coordination with these other committees, the NextGen Committee has built bridges to join and support all aspects of our Local Union. Our committee members have strived to gain awareness of the role of our Local Union and how we can support that role in the work place by attending and participating in Stewards courses and other educational endeavors. Further, at the monthly general meetings, our committee members make sure to welcome and inform new members to many facets of our Local Union.
